

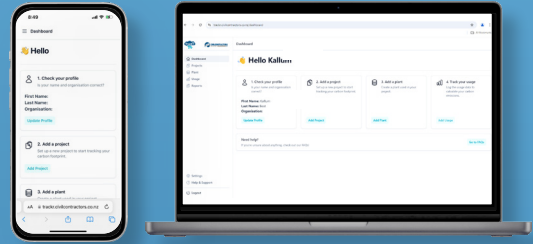

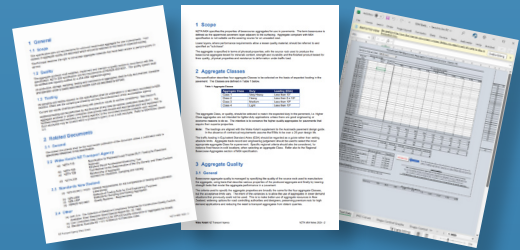
CCNZ has produced a new TTM resource library to support contractors, including resources, news, guides and more.

NZTA M04 SPECIFICATION BASECOURSE AGGREGATE

NZTA's M04 Specification for basecourse aggregate has recently been updated and is now in use around the motu. M04 and accompanying Notes sets out requirements for basecourse aggregate for use on state highways and other heavily trafficked roadways. M04 is the reference or standard specification for primary basecourse for heavy duty use in flexible pavements with thin surfacings. For more info contact Michelle.

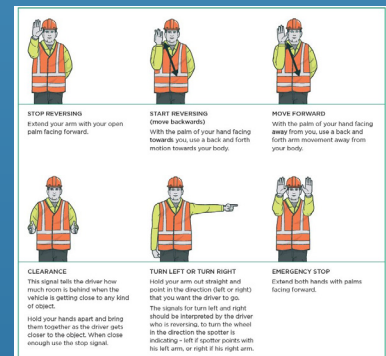
2. BITUMEN BURNS

CHANGES TO NZS3910 – WEBINAR

New Zealand's standard contract for the construction of building and civil engineering projects has been revised and released for consultation, and is now available on the Standards New Zealand website. The review process has been significant and is the biggest revision of the contract since 1987.

The changes will influence how construction contracts work for at least the next decade. It is vital that contractors understand the changes and provide their perspective as the cutoff for submissions is 30 June.

CCNZ and Dentons Kensington Swan held a webinar on the review of standard 3910 construction contracts.



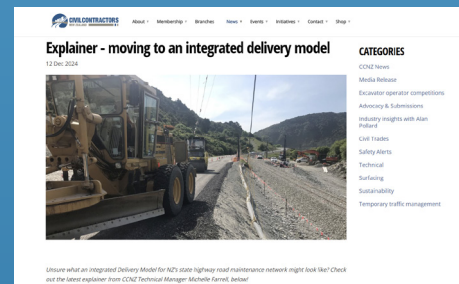
