    - National update
    - Conference got cancelled
    - General Council Meeting Online Different year
    - James craw On The Executive Council Acknowledgment
    - Over the last 5 year financial resources buildup @ \$400,000 in the bank
      - Enabled us to offer contractors and associates 2 month fees free period –
         recognizing the difficult times trying to retain members through a difficult period
    - Budgeted a loss of \$200,000
    - Few contractors declined the Fee Discount Offer
    - Budgeted for few resignations
    - Budgeted for no new companies joining
      - Opposite happened
    - NZTA Acknowlegement of JDs mention
    - Land transport fund GOVT now funding rail, cycling and pedestrian out of this fund so a bigger interest on the same fund.
    - Water Reform This will change the face on how the work is done
      - o Perhaps more money invested in–this inevitable
      - 5 Entities to manage water infrastructure assets
    - Ongoing advocacy done by National
      - Certainty around pipeline work
