*“Recognising excellence in the performance of Civil Contractors New Zealand (CCNZ) members in the **construction or management of assets.**”*

Construction Award Categories

1. Projects with a value of **less than \$5M**
Subcategories based on CCNZ Membership turnover categories:
 - A. **Small** – Companies with an annual turnover less than \$10M
 - B. **Large** – Companies with an annual turnover greater than \$10M
2. Projects with a value **between \$5M and \$20M**
3. Projects with a value **between \$20M and \$100M**
4. Projects with a value **greater than \$100M**
5. **Excellence in the maintenance and management of assets**, including routine maintenance projects.

Judging Process

The written submissions are assessed by the judges who will then select entries from each category for site visits. Following the site visits the judges will select the finalists. The entry documentation influences but does not determine the outcome.

The finalists all attend the Hirepool Construction Excellence Awards Dinner at the CCNZ annual conference where the winners of each category will be announced.

Entry submissions should address each of the following criteria (in the order outlined is recommended). In your submission, identify the unique characteristics that differentiate this project over others e.g. people, performance and training.

Categories 1, 2, 3 & 4

(up to 1,000 words) 10% contribution to score

- Skills/Training
- Engineering Controls
- Construction Programme
- Financial Management

Physical Works, Risk and Construction

Describe how risk/construction factors were managed, and overall project/contract results:

Risk

(up to 1,000 words) 20% contribution to score

- Site Factors/Ground or Physical Conditions
- Complexity
- Environment
- Location

- Contract Conditions
- Climate Conditions
- Other, e.g. Redesign

Construction

(up to 1,000 words) 20% contribution to score

- Complexity
- Quality
- Health & Safety
- Environmental

- Innovation

Category 5 - Maintenance and Management of Assets

Areas covered by this award include customer focus, levels of service, and improvements in efficiency and/or effectiveness, performance measures, data collection, reporting, analysis tools, improved cost management processes and delivery.

Work activities include routine maintenance, renewals and physical works. All infrastructure types are eligible.

Judges will consider:

- Asset Management, Planning and Control **10%**
- Collaboration/Relationships and Client Satisfaction **40%**
- Results – Effectiveness and Delivery **30%**
- Innovation **20%**

This award can apply to an individual asset, a group of assets or a network.

Entry requirements

1. All entries must be received by **Friday 31st May 2019, by 5.00pm.**
2. Entries will be submitted via the online portal at <https://ccnz-excellence.awardsplatform.com>
3. Entrants **must** include in their submission:
 - a. A copy of the Certificate of Practical Completion.
 - b. Evidence of **client satisfaction** in writing, demonstrated by a **letter/email from the client.**
 - c. Evidence of **customer satisfaction** (road users, adjoining property owners, stakeholders and neighbours), e.g. examples of the customer/s receiving good project information prior to and during the project or safety briefings; or feedback from stakeholders throughout the project.
 - d. A selection of **five high resolution photographs** are to be included on the USB stick. These photographs will be used for the awards presentations and awards booklet.
 - e. A **marketing statement** of no more than 200 words giving a brief description of the entry that can be used for media releases and award publications. This statement should include the project name, location, client, consultant and contractor details and the project commencement and completion dates.
4. Entries need to clearly show who the entrants are, regardless of the submission being individual or joint.
5. Entries should indicate any commercially sensitive information that should **not** be published.
